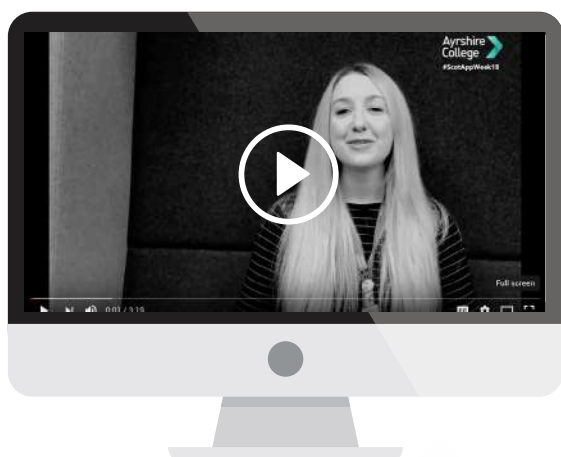

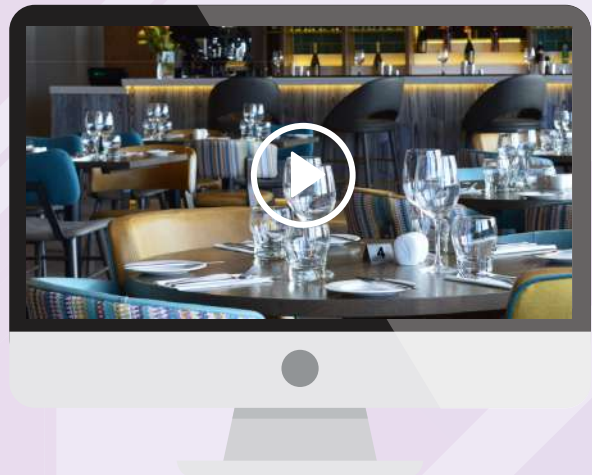

MISSION DISCOVERY



As the main sponsor of Mission Discovery, the Ayrshire College Foundation has a unique opportunity to help change the lives of hundreds of young people by raising their aspirations for an exciting career in science and engineering.

Mission Discovery is a programme that enables young people to work in teams with an astronaut, NASA leaders and world famous scientists for a week, to develop an idea for a space experiment. Teams then present their idea to a judging panel. The winning experiment is built, launched into space and transported to the International Space Station to be carried out over a month. Data is sent back to the winning team.

This programme is unique in enabling young people to have their ideas and experiments actually carried out in space. On the programme they learn leadership skills and how to work as part of a team. They develop their presentation skills, gain confidence and

learn the importance of having a hard work ethic.

Tracey Stark, Chair, said "If the young people can walk away from this programme with raised aspirations, believing you can become anything you want to be, you can make it happen, you can achieve your dreams, then we have achieved our mission as the main sponsor."

The Foundation has sponsored the Mission Discovery Space School for three years – reducing funding each year as new sponsors get involved in this unique event.

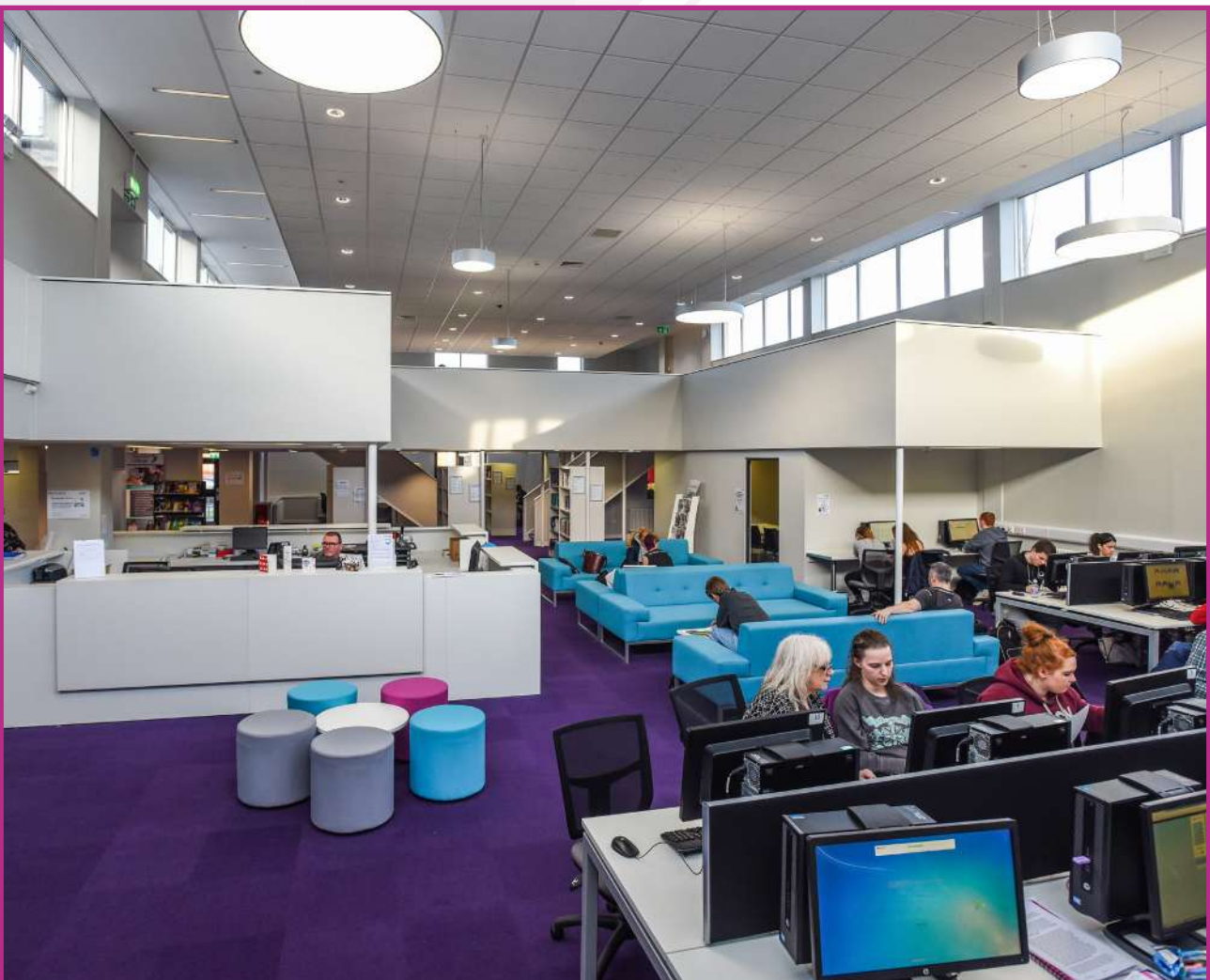

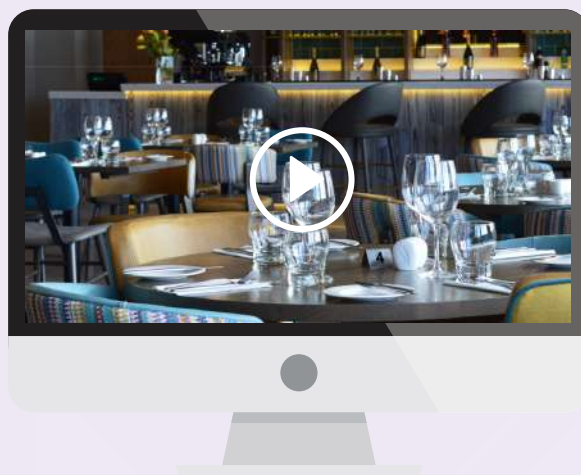
makes them feel they are working in a real restaurant and they are proud to be learning in such an inspiring environment."

EXCITING LEARNING AND SOCIAL SPACES CREATED ON THE KILWINNING CAMPUS

In the summer of 2017 major investment from the Ayrshire College Foundation was made to create the Learning Resource Centre (LRC), and a new Partnership Centre and Student Association office have been created. Improved breakout areas on the first and second floors of the campus provide students with social spaces for learning.

The LRC is now a more welcoming space and has been expanded to provide greater resources for the students.

The College's partners can use the new Partnership Centre for meetings and events when they are engaging with the College or for their own purposes.



A larger, more prominent Student Association office, visible from the moment students enter the campus, allows easy access to the Student Association team.

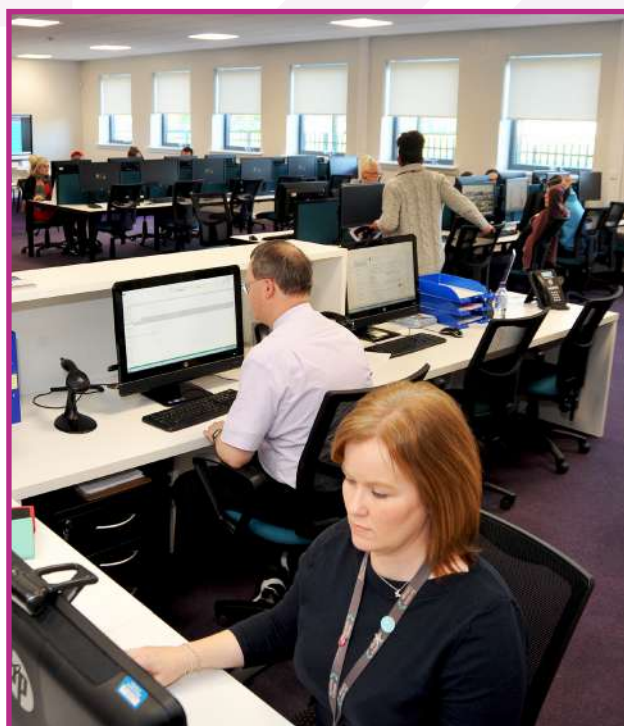

Lainey McKinlay, former Student President of the Ayrshire College Student Association, said "From speaking with students we know they are delighted with the new facilities. Throughout the first week of the new term we kept hearing students say the space and facilities were amazing. These top quality facilities will benefit many students for years to come."

These new facilities have also made an impact with partners in the local community. North Ayrshire Council in partnership with Ayrshire College has established their employability hub in the LRC to help them reach out to the community. This is a one-stop shop offering students and the wider community access to support finding employment, career advice, training and volunteering opportunities. There is also support available for managing debt, applying for benefits or housing, and developing skills in literacy, numeracy or computer skills.

INNOVATIVE AND HIGH PERFORMANCE ICT FOR AYRSHIRE COLLEGE STUDENTS

TOTAL SPEND

Ayrshire College Foundation provided match funding of £750,000 for a 3 year ICT investment plan which substantially improved the students learning experience. The plan focused on bringing the ageing ICT estate in Ayr, Kilwinning and Irvine campuses up to the same level as the new Kilmarnock Campus.

Ayrshire College has invested in virtual desktop infrastructure (VDI) and IGEL thin client technology. Rather than lock down classrooms with IT which limits how a building is used, this solution means that staff and students can log in from anywhere, and access their own personalised desktops and applications specific to their courses. It also means that ICT can be introduced to areas which previously didn't have it, such as motor vehicle workshops and beauty salons – enabling students to work where, when, and how they like.

When a student logs into their virtual desktop, they get access to a web browser, Microsoft Office, Adobe PDF packages, and an online learning tool from Moodle. They also get applications customised to their needs. For example, an engineering student gets applications specific to their course, computing students get applications designed for them and so on. It is a more versatile solution than serving everyone a standard desktop.

The way that students study today has changed. Gone are the large formal



libraries of old. Ayrshire College has vastly reduced the capacity of physical books. Now students work in smaller Learning Resource Centres accessing online resources, journals and eBooks all the time. It is therefore crucial that the desktop equipment is fast, reliable and robust.

Over a 3-year period this investment will increase the Citrix classroom provision by 2,100 end-users devices, which covers all the Ayr and Kilwinning campuses. The College also has a consistent standard of ICT within each Learning Resource Centre and been able to upgrade the network in the Kilwinning Campus.

GRADUATION

Ayrshire College students celebrated their graduation in style with three ceremonies in the Ayr Town Hall, the Grand Hall Kilmarnock and in the Abbey Church, Kilwinning.

More than 550 students who finished HNC and HND courses at the College, were joined by their family, friends and lecturers for the special occasion.

After the ceremony the graduates made the traditional procession from the venue back to

the College for a celebration buffet with their friends, families and lecturers.

Ayrshire College gives special recognition to a small selection of students at every graduation ceremony, based on lecturer nominations. 'Student of the Year' prize winners receive a trophy for their hard work over the year, while other trophies are handed out for 'Making a Difference in the Community' and 'Outstanding Achievement'.



CELEBRATION OF SUCCESS

This event was an opportunity to highlight exceptional achievement and to showcase some of the outstanding work of individual members of staff and teams across Ayrshire College in 2015. Students and staff were invited to make nominations for the categories: Excellence, Partnership, Empowerment, Innovation, Respect, Communication and Equality. A panel of judges selected the winners for each category, and they were presented with a trophy and certificate. WEST COAST VARSITY

TOTAL SPEND

£5,234

The West Coast Varsity brought together students from Ayrshire College, the University of the West of Scotland (UWS) and the Scottish Rural College (SRUC) to compete in the only Varsity sports event in the UK where universities and colleges were competing against each other.

This day-long sporting event included football, rugby, netball, basketball, volleyball, badminton, golf and archery and the tournaments were held in the Dam Park Stadium, Troon Darnley Golf Course and the Citadel in Ayr.

Students from all campuses participated and were coached by fellow students, with the support of lecturing staff. Sports students from Ayrshire College were involved in the development and planning of this event and officials came from the SFA and Scottish Rugby.

The ethos behind the event was to unite the College community and universities to help motivate and inspire those involved, and break down some of the barriers that exist between further and higher education.

Ayrshire College students also used this experience as part of their course assessments.

HND Sports Coaching and Development students completed their 'Managing a Sport Event' which is an SQA requirement. Hospitality students looked after the specially invited guests in the VIP area.

Media students created film and photography which was used to enhance their portfolios, as well as providing marketing materials for the next year's event to gain sponsorship.

South Ayrshire Active Schools attended with pupils from local schools helping to build on the community partnerships the College has with South Ayrshire Council. The pupils also gained an understanding of some of the courses they could do at College.

This innovative summer school was the first of its kind in Ayrshire and ran over three days in the Kay Parish Church hall.

The workshops included tune learning, composition, arranging skills and group work, delivered by three top musicians; Jennifer Butterworth (MG Alba Scots Tutor of the Year 2015, Royal Conservatoire of

Scotland), Adam Sutherland (Session A9, Treacherous Orchestra, Adam Sutherland School of Fiddle) and Emma Tomlinson (The Routes Quartet, The Royal Conservatoire of Scotland).

big playground however, until the installation of our Trim Trail we didn't have much in it to stimulate play. Now it is a fun and creative space for children to play independently, challenge themselves and take risks in a safe environment.

Emphasis on outdoor learning and play is an important part of curriculum and this equipment provides the opportunity for this to take place. The Trim Trail provides a year-round facility which can be used by pupils from primary 1-7 during breaks and lunchtime as well as during the school day.”

Ambitious for Ayrshire



Innovating for Learning

Ayrshire College Foundation will provide £250,000 over three years for an Innovating for Learning Fund, to recognise creativity and improvement in curriculum and service design, content or delivery.

In the first year, grants of between £5,000 and £25,000 were offered to assist with implementing innovative practice to support learning and teaching, or enhance service delivery to increase student success.

The fund was developed to provide start-up funding for innovative or exploratory projects, and bids focused on new approaches or initiatives that will enhance learning and teaching, service delivery and/or the student experience.

The Foundation has so far approved nine applications, with funding totalling £61,295.80. These projects include:

Hospitality and Tourism

Delivery of work experience in the Salt & Barrel training restaurant



The funding will pay for hospitality interns. This will enable the Salt & Barrel training restaurant to remain open over the summer. The interns will work along with a team of student volunteers to provide relevant work experience and prepare them for going out into the hospitality industry.

Health and Social Care

Enhanced CPR and First Aid training equipment



The Health and Social Care department have used their funding to buy new QCPR mannequins to teach CPR skills. Feedback from the students has been very positive, as the new equipment gives immediate visual feedback on the practical application of CPR skills. This has led to a definite, consistent and continued improvement in the specific CPR quality metrics of chest compression depth, rate, adequate chest recoil, correct hand positioning and quality of rescue breaths.

Scottish Fire and Rescue have also utilised the new mannequins for CPR revision training. As it is proposed that SFAR in the near future will be called out to deal with OHCA's (Out of Hospital Cardiac Arrests) the visual feedback offered by the new equipment allows them to further develop high quality CPR skills.

Sound Production students at Ayrshire College are making big noises in the music industry by running their own record label and PR company from the College's Ayr Campus.

The project has been, and continues to be, a big success. Both Sun Turtle Records and High Tide PR are integrated into the HNC curriculum providing a rich educational experience for the students. The label has signed a local indie pop band 'Mannequin Mannequin' who have already recorded, mixed and mastered their double A-Side single: "Sunburn / Chiaroscuro" in the College studio. This record was released digitally and physically on 19 May 2018, supported by an exclusive launch night event in Kilmarnock.

A significant part of our funding application was to equip the studio with a range of analogue and digital processing units. This equipment has been successfully installed and commissioned and is responsible for the clear and powerful sound heard on the recordings. This new level of professionalism is validated by the press and radio plays already received.

In addition to the curriculum integration, students applied for studio internship positions. The successful students attended a number of production masterclasses that provided them with the skills to be assistant recording engineers on the official release. Marketing, events and web design evening masterclasses have also taken place, providing the students with the specialist knowledge critical to running the label.



Creative

AC Productions



The purpose of this project is to provide a project-based creative environment for students where they can develop essential freelance skills. The project has been created to help address the high demand for video content from local businesses, College departments, charities and local services. Staff

will manage the production and provide technical support. Students will occupy technical and creative roles through all stages of production. Briefs, deadlines and quality are driven by the needs of the client.

The key objective is to improve the destination outcomes for media students, either articulation to degree programmes or direct entry into employment or freelance work. The funding will cover staff costs and enable the department to purchase a new camera, lights and other consumables.

AC Productions has now received all of the equipment included in the bid and have begun producing content for various projects. The first video of a cookery demonstration has been filmed.

Health and Social Care

Ageing suits

This resource will enable students to experience, through simulated learning, the physical and psychological impact of ageing. The sensory equipment provides realistic experiences of what it's like to be elderly and conditions associated with dementia, including poor balance, stiff joints, weaker eyesight, extra weight, difficulty in walking, back pain and problems with lifting.

Learning Resources and Technology

The use of drones in education

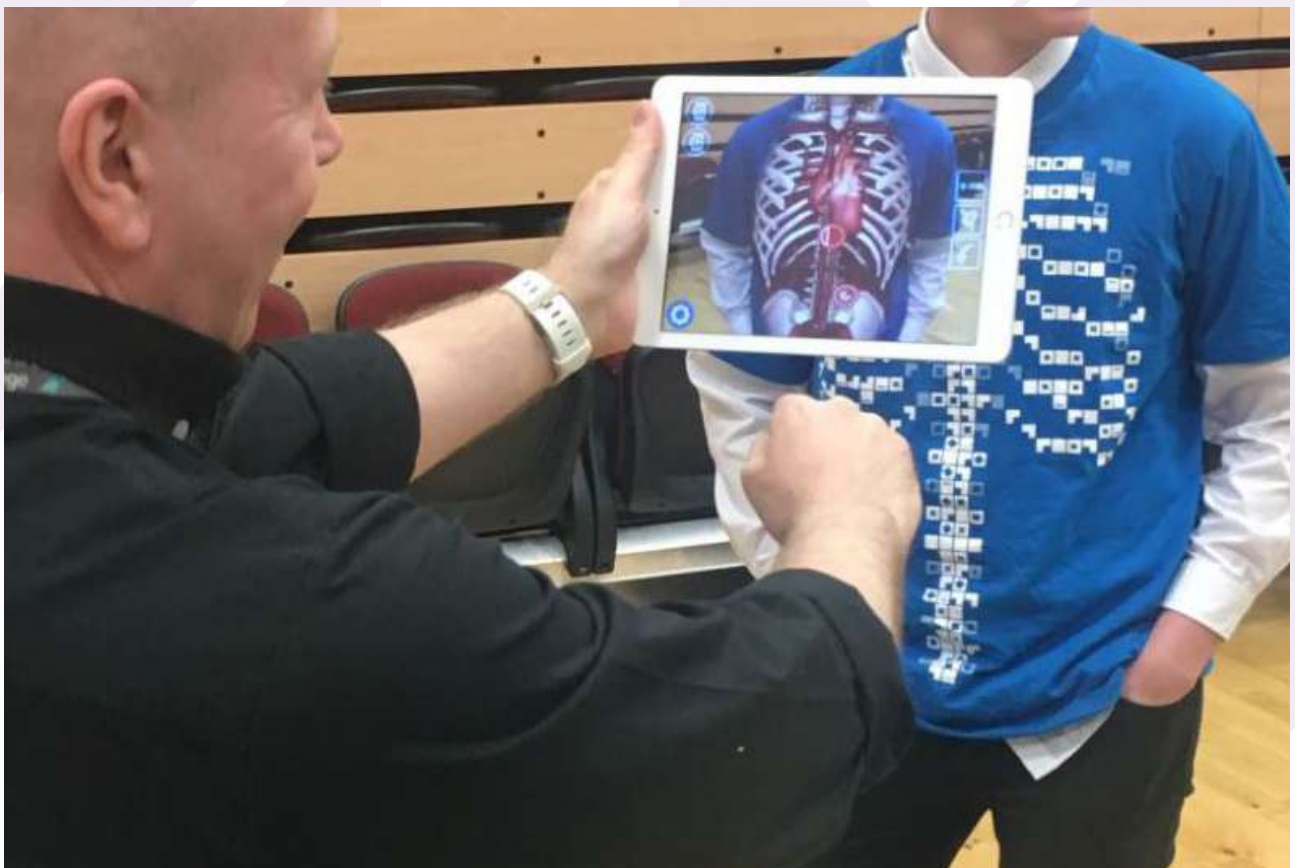
The drone will enhance learning and teaching provision as well as emulate the increased use of this technology in industry. This will contribute to improved learning and teaching by adding a different element to some subjects.



Learning Resources and Technology

Installation of MDM server to better improve the usage and maintenance of College iPads

The funding is being used to install a Mobile Device Management System, which will enable full remote management of the class sets of iPads which are bookable from each Learning Resource Centre. Having this system will enable Learning Technologists to access and control multiple devices at the one time. The funds requested will cover the cost of a year's licence for 20 iPads per campus.



The funding has been used to recruit creative and digital marketing interns and give them an opportunity to be part of the Marketing Team. The project will create and inspire exciting careers that will shape their digital future.

To achieve cutting edge digital marketing, diverse skills and perspectives are needed. Young people bring creativity, enthusiasm, fresh ideas and problem solving to our teams. Ayrshire College creative and business students can help with this.

Over the summer, the interns will have big challenges, real responsibilities and a great network of support to develop their employability skills.

This project will take talented young people who are showing great potential on their course, and give them an opportunity to be part of our team and make an impact. This experience will help shape them, push them forward and leave a lasting impression. They will find no better environment to achieve their full potential.

The experience they will have, and the skills they will learn, will help them in their university course, and, help them become more employable when they leave college. They will also work on their digital portfolio and LinkedIn accounts.
